

From the President



The momentum created in 2007 with the formation of the UDIS (You and the Disabled) Forum rolled onto 2008 too with steady consolidation of activities and expansion of new ventures. The private sector has opened up and it is more positive to appoint persons with disabilities than ever before. The experience of

the past two years clearly reveals that job mapping is more important in finding placement and as a result, the UDIS Forum has taken up a systematic study to identify potential job opportunities in various types of industries and listing skills that should be developed in persons with disabilities. This study, which will be completed in early 2009, will help us approach employment issues with specific focus.

The growth of higher education of girls with visual impairment is another satisfying experience. In 2007, 61 girls with visual impairment enrolled in higher education in the southern states were assisted by the UDIS Forum to get scholarship from the Marga Schulze Foundation through CBM. The students of the first year really made an impact, which is evident from the fact that in 2008, more than 140 girls applied for the scholarship. The Forum and CBM are happy that education of girls, which is neglected to some extent, is receiving due attention through the positive impact created by visually impaired girls themselves. In 2008, 115 girls received scholarship. We are sure these girls will become role models for other girls with visual impairment. We encouraged them to learn technology and 12 of them received laptops to enhance their learning experiences.

The Youth Wing on Disability Services (YWDIS) has performed beyond our expectations. The YWDIS stands out as a testimony for how the youth force could be channelised for constructive activities. They have elected their own office bearers and went to different colleges to conduct sensitisation programmes on disability services. Besides they have gone to schools to orient young children to understand the capabilities of persons with disabilities. We are happy to note that many young children have already identified persons with

disabilities in their communities and referred them to schools and rehabilitation programmes. The YWDIS also conducted essay writing and oratorical contests for school and college students. The UDIS Forum facilitated the YWDIS activities but it is the enthusiasm of the YWDIS members that made all the difference. We are proposing to start similar youth wings in different parts of the State. Working with Parents and Disabled Peoples' Organisations is another rewarding experience.

We were glad when many organisations wanted to emulate the UDIS Network concept in various regions of the country. Our concept of "Expanding Services without Creating Institutions" caught the imagination of various organisations and we are asked to provide necessary technical expertise to make this a reality. Besides CBM, the Sightsavers International has come forward to nurture the network concept through its partners in the south and also in promoting new partners. The Forum has started identifying potential organisations in the States of Tamil Nadu and Kerala who could work as effective partners of network to promote employment opportunities for persons with disabilities.

CBM invited the UDIS Forum to make presentation on the network concept in its meetings organised for its Partners in New Delhi, Pune, Visakhapatnam, Thiruvananthapuram, and Coimbatore and we are thrilled that the concept is applauded.

The office bearers of the Forum provided tremendous support for the implementation of the vision of the UDIS Forum and I thank profoundly the Executive Director and staff of the Forum for carrying out the activities with great devotion.

Another year of constructive activities has come to a close, but the experiences have given us a lot of wisdom to make the services in the future effective. CBM motivated us at every stage and at every new venture and the work of the Forum is a living example for the principle of CBM "Together We Can Do More."

CBM (Christoffel-Blindenmission / Christian Blind Mission) was founded by the German Pastor Ernst Jakob Christoffel in 1908, purporting to improve the quality of life of the world's poorest persons with disabilities and those at risk of disability. CBM works with partner organisations in low income countries to both develop and ensure that persons with disabilities and their families have ready access to affordable and comprehensive health care and rehabilitation programmes, quality education programmes and livelihood opportunities. Working with persons with disabilities. CBM advocates for their inclusion in all aspects of society. CBM uses comprehensive, sustainable and community-focussed approaches which contribute to poverty alleviation and self-reliance. CBM partners develop high quality preventive, curative, educational, rehabilitative, livelihood and advocacy programmes which are designed to

maximize the quality of life of persons with disabilities. CBM is supporting 1,016 projects in 113 countries in Africa, Asia, Latin America and Eastern Europe and currently reaches 18 million people worldwide.

CBM cooperates with UN agencies, global organisations and disabled peoples' organisations to promote and develop international alliances and programmes with and for persons with disabilities. CBM is recognised as a Collaborating Organisation by the World Health Organization and has consultative status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). In cooperation with the World Health Organization (WHO) and as a member of the International Agency for the Prevention of Blindness (IAPB), CBM founded and launched "Vision 2020: The Right to Sight". The goal of Vision 2020 is to eliminate avoidable blindness by the year 2020. CBM is also working with WHO and other stakeholders to create an international initiative "WWHearing" (World-Wide Hearing Care for Developing Countries) for the provision of affordable hearing aids for hearing impaired people in low income countries.

The UDIS Forum is a project of the CBM India Trust and we owe the success of our work to the tremendous support extended by CBM. The Forum thanks Mrs. Gunawathy Fernandez, Regional Director, CBM-South Asia Regional Office (South) and Mrs. Silvana Mehra, Regional Director, CBM-South Asia Regional Office (North) for providing opportunities to present the UDIS network concept at the meetings of its Partners organised in various parts of India to celebrate the 100 years of CBM.

The UDIS Forum organises its activities under various objective based schemes. The detailed progress under each scheme is enumerated below:


Employment Guidance Programme (EGP)





I lost my left lower limb due to polio during my early childhood. After my 10th Standard in the local school. I did my Diploma in Electronics and Communication Engineering. To develop the employability skills, I also passed typewriting examinations in

both Tamil and English. Further, I did a Diploma in Computer Applications and a short term course in MS Office, too. In spite of these qualifications, I remained jobless for more than 6 months. Later knowing about the UDIS Forum I registered with them, who facilitated a job with the PEROT SYSTEMS, a BPO company. I am thankful to the officials of the Forum who showed a direction in my life.

I was infected by polio when I was young and both my lower limbs and left upper limb were affected. I have passed my Higher Secondary examinations with 82% of marks. Later, I did my B.Com (C.A) in the Annamalai University. Right now, apart from

working in the Cheran Region Christian Society as a Computer Operator, which was facilitated by the UDIS Forum, I am also pursuing my MBA through distance education in the Bharathiar University. My thanks are due to the staff of the Forum for securing me this job, without which I might be groping in the dark, still.

I am a low vision person and I did all my schooling in a regular school. With constant support and encouragement from my parents and teachers, I completed my Bachelor's degree in Social Work. Hailing from a poor family it was a compulsion to look for a source of income. But to add woes to my

disability, I was denied job opportunities by a couple of firms citing low vision as the reason. Dejected by the poor response, I later registered with the UDIS Forum. To my surprise, the Forum had facilitated a job at the Pricol Packaging Private Limited with a decent salary. Now I am self reliant and happy with my job. Thanks to the Forum officials for facilitating this job and instilling confidence in me.

My son is mild mentally retarded compounded with speech problems. Due to his disability condition, employment was beyond the reach for him. Dejected by the nature of his disability, we had no cue to offer

and was on the lookout for a job with a steady income. Later knowing about the existence of UDIS forum I also registered with them. Thanks to the efforts of the UDIS Forum, facilitating an interview with the KG Apparels, Karamadai, where I was selected for the packing section.

I am a hearing impaired and with great difficulty I did my 10th standard. With due support from my parents I did a Diploma Course in DTP also. However I was not able to secure a job for a longer time. Registering my

name with the UDIS Forum bore me immediate result in the form of a job at V Serve Solutions. My parents are very much happy that I have secured a job and I am sure I can go still a long way. Thanks to the UDIS Forum for facilitating a meaningful job, within a short span of time.

Further to securing of jobs, the following activities were also carried out under the Employment Guidance Programme.

- ♦ The representatives of UDIS Forum participated in the Private Employers Campaigns being conducted by the District Employment Exchange, Coimbatore during the second Friday of every month to collect details of companies and the occasions were utilized to persuade some of the employers and HR personnel to provide employment for persons with disabilities.
- UDIS Forum and Sree Saraswathi Thyagaraja College, Pollachi have entered into a collaboration to initiate placement services for persons with disabilities in the Pollachi and Udumalpet regions.

Sensitisation Programme on "Right to Work and Employment of Persons with Disabilities"

The UDIS Forum organised a Sensitisation Programme on "Right to Work and Employment of Persons with Disabilities" sponsored by the National Institute for the Visually Handicapped -Regional Centre, Chennai on 26 September 2008 at CSI Bishop Appasamy College of Arts and Science. The programme was inaugurated by Mrs. Susheila Williams Sargunar, Secretary, CSI Bishop Appasamy College of Arts and Science. Dr. M.N.G. Mani, President, UDIS Forum in his keynote address stressed the importance of employment for persons with disabilities. Dr. I. Fernandez, Regional Director, CBM SARO(S) inaugurated the seminar and spoke on the role of social workers in the welfare of persons with disabilities. Dr. M.N.G. Mani, President, UDIS Forum presided.

Dr. K. Muralidharan, Reader, Department of Social Work, PSG College of Arts and Science shared his experiences in serving persons with disabilities. More than 40 social work faculties from all over Tamil Nadu attended the seminar. The seminar had several brainstorming sessions on disability issues and social work implications and interventions. Several resolutions were made at the seminar which included writing to the Universities to include a component on disability in the Master of Social Work course curriculum (MSW); to involve the social work students in serving persons with disabilities in the vicinity of

The website www.davo.in launched by the UDIS Forum continues to serve as a referral point for organisations for persons with disabilities to post their institution profiles and also to access information related to disability. As of December 2008, 49 Organisations and Institutions from different parts of the country posted their profiles on the website for information exchange. Advocacy programmes pertinent to issues concerning disability have the potential to create a positive impact towards the quantum and quality of services for the persons with disabilities. During 2008 the UDIS Forum conducted the following activities towards advocacy.

The representatives of UDIS Forum attended 6 panchayat level camps for persons with disabilities organised by the District Disability Rehabilitation Office, Coimbatore during the month of August 2008 to enroll adult persons with disabilities looking for employment and to create awareness on government concessions and facilities available for persons with disabilities.

The UDIS Forum office bearers participated and addressed in the awareness programme on disability services and rehabilitation for community workers conducted by the Department of Social Work, Sree Saraswathi Thyagaraja College, Pollachi on 5 July 2008.

Dr. M.N.G. Mani, President, UDIS Forum inaugurated and delivered a talk at the ADD-INDIA sponsored programme, "Right Based Approaches" on 27 September 2008. which was organised by the Coimbatore Association of NGOs and Welfare Institutions for persons with disabilities (CANWIN). Awarding Laptops to visually impaired girls

The MASS scheme, besides assisting students to undergo higher education, also aims at developing the skills of the learners in Information and Communication Technology, Orientation and Mobility and skills in using assistive devices. For 2007-2008, the beneficiaries of the scheme attended a two weeks IT training at the Avinashilingam University (for the western region) during 1-21 October 2007 and at the IT Centre for visually impaired at Keelottivakkam (for the eastern region) during 19-28 November 2007. In all, 32 students underwent this training and later an assessment team headed by a technology expert Mrs. Usha from the CBM South Asia Regional Office, Bangalore conducted a skill test on 18-19 February 2008 at the Avinashilingam University and selected 12 students. On May 5, 2008, during the occasion of the birthday celebrations of Rev.T.S. Avinashilingam, Founder-Chancellor of the Avinashilingam University, laptops were presented to the students by Mr. T.K. Shanmuganandam, Chancellor of the University. Mr. V.K. Lakshmanan, Ex-MLA delivered a special lecture on the contributions of the Founder-Chancellor for the cause of education and national development. Dr. Saroja Prabhakaran, Vice-Chancellor offered felicitations. Dr. M.N.G. Mani, President, UDIS Forum addressed on the work of CBM and described the future plans of the Marga-Schulze Scholarship Scheme for empowering more girls with visual impairment.

Training and Employment Network with Non-Governmental Organisations (TENNGO)

To strengthen the services for persons with disabilities the UDIS Forum works in liaison with other NGOs working in the field of disability. Following is a list of activities carried out during the year 2008.

- A meeting of the Non-Governmental Organisations was organised in Tirunelveli on 21 January 2008, which was attended by representatives of 58 NGOs.
- A meeting of voluntary organisations was conducted at Namakkal on 25 March 2008 to provide guidance to organisations willing to commence disability related services. Representatives of 55 voluntary organisations from Namakkal, Erode, Karur and Salem districts attended the programme.


- representatives of self-help groups to assist persons with disabilities through creation of self-employment opportunities. They also addressed persons with disabilities and their families at a function organised by the Rotary Club of Ambasamudram to orient them on various welfare schemes.
- The officials of the UDIS Forum had discussions with the officials of Grama Udhayam, Tirunelveli on organizing training, providing assistance and creating employment opportunities to persons with disabilities at Tirunelveli under the Training and Employment Network with Non-Governmental Organisations (TENNGO) scheme.
- Mr. S. Subramania Siva, Vice President, UDIS Forum was elected as the Treasurer of Coimbatore Association of NGOs and Welfare Institutions for persons with disabilities (CANWIN) in the meeting held at Kovai Rehabilitation and Information Services for the Handicapped (KRISH) on 30 August 2008.
- A Meeting of the Coimbatore Association of NGOs and Welfare Institutions for Persons with Disabilities was conducted at the UDIS Forum Administrative Office on 19 November 2008. Mrs. C. Jasmine, DDRO, Coimbatore, Dr. K. Narendran, President, CANWIN and others attended the meeting. Dr. M.N.G. Mani, President, UDIS Forum outlined the need to include pre-vocational skills in the curriculum of special schools, which would contribute to employment skills when they grow as adults.

Working with Organisations of Parents and Persons with Disabilities

The UDIS Forum works closely with Disabled Peoples' Organisations to raise advocacy issues and also to offer training to persons with disabilities. Following is a list of the activities carried out in this direction during 2008.

With CALIBER (Disabled Peoples' Organisation in the area of Locomotor Disability)

- Embroidery training commenced on 13 April 2008 for 10 persons with locomotor disabilities.
- Basic computer training for 43 persons with various disabilities was offered, of which 5 of them were facilitated employment. 18 persons with disabilities were also offered a basic typewriting course.

- 27 persons with disabilities were offered training in DTP of which 3 of them secured employment.
- A spoken English course was conducted for 22 persons with disabilities.

With ARVIC (Disabled Peoples' Organisation in the area of Visual Impairment)

- The UDIS Forum and Association for Rights of the Visually Challenged (ARVIC), an organisation of persons with visually challenged in Coimbatore, entered into a Memorandum of Understanding on 4 January 2008, on the occasion of Louis Braille's Birthday to facilitate services for persons with visual impairment.
- A basic training course on Braille reading and writing for 6 adults with visual impairment is being conducted by ARVIC at UDIS Administrative Office.

For the benefit of visually impaired persons to venture into self employment and also to secure jobs, a Tag file manufacturing-cum-training unit functioning at ARVIC is being partly supported by the UDIS Forum.

OTHER EVENTS

- A meeting with different Associations of the Deaf was conducted on 1 February 2008 to formulate strategies to increase job opportunities for persons with hearing impairment.
- A Memorandum of Understanding with the Coimbatore Association for the Deaf (CAD) was signed on 16 April 2008. As per the MOU, the Forum and the CAD agreed to jointly organise leadership training activities, pre-employment training, sports, cultural activities, etc., involving hearing impaired persons. Concrete activities in this direction are yet to begin.
- Mr. S. Subramania Siva, Vice President, UDIS Forum delivered a talk on "Promotion of Parents Organisation and Disabled Peoples Organisation" at the 2nd Regional Parents Meet on 20 September 2008 at Tirunelveli. The parents meet was organised by the Tamil Nadu State Coordination Committee of PARIVAAR (TNSCCP) and the National Institute for the Mentally Handicapped (NIMH). The Forum takes part in various advocacy activities of SAARATHY PAMMAC, an organisation of parents of mentally retarded children in Coimbatore.

Sports Meet

UDIS Forum co-sponsored a Sports Meet for children with disabilities from schools in Coimbatore district on 12 November 2008. The District Collector, Coimbatore, inaugurated the Sports Meet. 25 children with visual impairment, 119 with hearing impairment, 145 with mental retardation and 45 with locomotor disability participated in the sports meet. The prizes were distributed on the World Disability Day function at Star Special School. The UDIS Forum believes that sports activities develop great team spirit among children with disabilities and such events will be conducted in the future too with an aim of preparing young disabled students for the Special Olympics.

The UDIS Forum facilitated a meeting of select NGOs and Disabled Peoples Organisations with Ms. Shweta Chooramani and Mr. Ketan Kothari, officials from Sightsavers International, Mumbai to explore the possibilities of developing network in various parts of the state to strengthen employment activities for persons with disabilities and also to strengthen advocacy activities to ensure their rights. The officials expressed that the UDIS Network concept has potential to optimize services with least infrastructure and capital expenditure. A concept paper is being developed in this regard and the Forum is already in the process of identifying potential partners in the states of Tamil Nadu and Kerala who could become part of the network to promote employment opportunities.
